Message From Mayor Neff

Lots going on in September, from affordable housing and antique cars, to Challenger Field parking and racing in the streets (sorry Mr. Springsteen). Also, marijuana.

But first, please keep in mind that Red Bank Regional High School, Point Road School and Markham Place School are all back in session starting September 6. **Please** drive safely.

For those of you with children at Point Road, you will see **improvements at the parking lot** adjacent to the playground and ballfield, the result of a successful collaboration between the school and the municipality. At this writing, the lot is nearly complete and is expected to be ready for the start of school.

The municipality is also seeking grant funding (with a hearing on the grant application likely at a September council meeting) for the construction of a **parking lot and restroom facilities adjacent to Challenger Field**. The intent is to address parking issues that occur there during well-attended athletic events.

For those of you who enjoy the trails near Challenger and elsewhere in town, our resident trail expert and caretaker, **John Heidema, has written another of his updates on trail conditions and observations**, which can be found on www.littlesilver.org. Foxes! Ospreys! Poison ivy! Owls! Where else can you read the hyphenation "warble-toot?"

John's column never fails to both inform and entertain, and you'll surely pick up some suggestions for local

walking areas, and things to look for while you stroll.

Looking back quickly, in August we were treated to **Sunday concerts** by local musicians, which served as a reminder of the extraordinary talent living right here in town. Thanks to our recreation department and to our musicians for a real treat.

And of course thanks to the Little Silver Police department for hosting **National Night Out** – a great community event where residents of all ages were treated to demonstrations, displays, food and drink, and a great chance to meet our police and our volunteer Fire Department and EMS.

In September, we're looking forward to the **Little Silver 5K** on the 30th. To register for this great race and school fundraiser, go to www.littlesilver5k.com. In addition to the well-regarded 5k, there will be a kids' fun run before the 9:30 event at RBR, and kiddie dashes afterward at 10:30.

Also coming up is a presentation at the restored Parker Homestead Horse Barn by Joseph Grabas, local author and historian, entitled **Slavery in Early Monmouth County**. The presentation at the Homestead is scheduled for September 16 at 2 p.m. All are welcome.

Later in the month, on September 23 from 10 to 2, the Parker Homestead presents its **Antique and Vintage Car Show**. The Homestead expects nearly 100 vehicles from the early 1900s. Participant registration starts at 8:30.

In local government, with the support of our schools and police department, the Borough Council has

introduced an ordinance that would expressly exclude from our business zones **establishments that sell recreational marijuana** and related paraphernalia. A public hearing will be scheduled in September.

In addition, the council has introduced multiple ordinances to put into effect its **settlement of the low- and moderate-income housing litigation**. A special meeting was held in August on the topic, and for those who missed it, the meeting is on Youtube and the full presentation can be found on www.littlesilver.org. There is also a newspaper article on the presentation at www.trtnj.com, the website for the Two River Times, which has been covering the issue.

A public hearing on the ordinances is scheduled for the September 10 regular Borough Council meeting, at which time our planning professionals will be on hand to answer any additional questions.

In a town like Little Silver, with limited vacant, buildable lots, the affordable housing obligation poses a challenge. Failure to create a reasonable opportunity for its construction, however, exposes the town to a "developer's remedy" lawsuit, in which a developer would seek to override local zoning and planning authority and compel its construction.

Like many municipalities, Little Silver has sought (and currently has) protection from such suits, and approval by the courts of this settlement will mean continued protection through 2025.

Lastly, for those that have been following the **Brickwall at Little Silver restaurant/bar application** before the Planning and Zoning Board, the first day of hearings took place in August, with a second day presently scheduled for October 18.

On behalf of the governing body, we wish everyone a happy Labor Day, and again remind everyone that our schools open September 6 - take it easy behind the wheel, please. 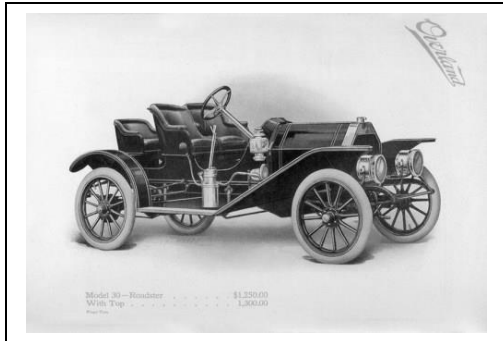
