That is true of most of the towns in our area. Paraphrasing Fiorello La Guardia, the famous New York mayor, there isn't a Republican way or a Democratic way to pick up the garbage. There's just a right way, and a wrong way.

So the closest you'll get to politics here is this: we encourage everyone in this contentious election season, no matter what your persuasion, to vote.

Election Day is November 8. Three days later, on November 11, we celebrate Veterans Day. The two have a solemn connection. Our Veterans, and there are many from Little Silver, fought to preserve government "by the people" here and abroad. It's not a perfect system, and it can get pretty messy, but it means everyone has a vote. So please honor our veterans by stopping by your polling place, signing in with our friendly election workers, stepping into the voting booth, and pulling the lever – or these days, pushing the

button – for the candidates of your choice.

I hear some say that, especially with respect to the presidential election, it is tempting to "sit this one out." Please don't.

There was a local mayor a couple years back who was particularly helpful and hardworking, and an asset to the Two River Council of Mayors. He was a wealth of information, and reached out to all of his fellow mayors, regardless of party affiliation, to help or lend advice.

Two years after I met him, he lost a local election – by one vote. And that's not the only time that has happened.

So every vote makes a difference. Please make the effort.

You might also honor our veterans by stopping by our simple ceremony at 11 a.m. on November 11 in Memorial Park to commemorate **Veterans Day**. It isn't elaborate or lengthy, but it's genuine, and all are welcome to attend and take a moment to reflect on the sacrifices of those who protect us.

Also coming up on November 25 is the **White Road Cup**, an annual friendly football rivalry between Little Silver and Shrewsbury. This year, games will be played between teams of adults and kids of all ages, starting at 9 a.m., with the adult men's game starting at 1 p.m.
