## Message From Mayor Neff

Through a continued shared services agreement, Little Silver's emergency notification system is about to improve and, at the same time, become less costly. My message this month: ***sign up today to help us reach every resident in an emergency.***

The borough is also saying farewell to a treasured employee and devoted resident, and continues to assist its Sandy victims. Read on for more information.

First, Little Silver and Shrewsbury boroughs, their elementary schools, and Red Bank Regional High School are changing their emergency notification service provider. The new company, Code Red, will deliver clearer voice messages to your phones, and will send immediate e-mail, web and text alerts in an emergency. It has been used by other local municipalities with great success, and is a bit easier on the pocketbook.

While the provider name is changing, the name of the system itself, Two River Alert, will remain the same, and you will continue to find registration instructions under that name on the borough's web site, [www.littlesilver.org](http://www.littlesilver.org), by clicking on the Two River Alert button on the left side of the home page.

So on to what you're really interested in: signing up. The contact information you may already have in the Two River Alert system should transfer automatically to the new provider. However, your Governing Body wants to make absolutely sure that the transition is truly seamless, and that residents receive messages on the land lines, cell phone numbers, email addresses, and at residential addresses most important to them.

To make that happen, please register now – even if you have been registered on the Two River Alert system for years - by going to <https://public.coderedweb.com/CNE/BF989F572F2E>. Our long-standing registration site, [www.TwoRiverAlert.com](http://www.TwoRiverAlert.com), will be continued, and you should be able to register there as well, likely by the time this Newsletter comes out.

If you don't have a computer, you may fill out the sign up form included with this Newsletter (also available at Borough Hall) and deliver it to the Little Silver Police Department.

If you have any difficulty, Code Red invites you to call 866-939-0911 for assistance. For most everyone, however, signing up is very simple. I did it, and I'm not real fond of passwords and log-in names. So if I can do it, anyone can. Please sign up, and tell your friends and neighbors. When the next storm is bearing down, you'll be glad you did.

And speaking of storms, the borough is continuing to assist our Sandy victims by hosting CPC Behavioral Healthcare one night a week at the Women's Club. We are advised that many victims begin to feel the emotional effects six months and even a year after the event. The counseling service is free to the town and to our residents, so we encourage anyone who might benefit from a discussion or two, or more, with a counselor, to pay them a visit. **Notice From Tax Collector:**

**Residents can expect to receive their new 2013 property tax bills by the end of July.**

Once again, the bills will be delayed due to certification of state aid figures required to be reported on the individual bills. The grace period for payment of August taxes may be extended. State law requires that municipalities allow a 25 day grace period from the date of mailing. The extended due date, if applicable, will be noted on the top, left portion of your new tax bill.

**Filing Deadline Extended**

The deadline for residents to file 2012 Senior Freeze (Property Tax Reimbursement) applications has been extended to September 16, 2013. The original deadline was June 3.

**JCP&L Upgrades Website For Assistance in Power Outages**

Mayor Neff recently attended a meeting with the new president of JCP&L and reports the electric company's pitch is that it heard our complaints about maintenance of its equipment, and communicating with residents during outages. The proof, he says, will come when the next outage occurs, particularly an extended or wide-spread outage. In the meantime, please familiarize yourselves with JCP&L's new website, [www.firstenergycorp.com](http://www.firstenergycorp.com). It contains new town-specific features and notification information, along with useful tools during a power outage.

**Mosquito Season Upon Us Again**

The Monmouth County Mosquito Extermination Commission again reminds residents to help prevent mosquitoes:

- Keep buckets, wheel barrows, trash bins, etc. free of standing water.
- Change water in kiddie pools, pet dishes and bird baths at least every seven days.
- Discard all unwanted containers like empty cans, flower pots, old tires. Note: Monmouth County residents can dispose of rim-less tires, free of charge, at the Monmouth County Reclamation Center. For information call 732-683-8686 or visit [www.visitmonmouth.com](http://www.visitmonmouth.com).
