Message From Mayor Neff

With the arrival of September, fall recreation activities are filling the ball fields, and other activity around town continues to make Little Silver the vibrant, family-oriented small town we all enjoy.

You may have noticed the sign in front of Borough Hall has been removed. For years, Little Silver was fortunate to have had a wonderful wood-and-brick structure for posting important information.

For those who don't know, long-time resident Henry Scaccia donated that sign to announce events or advise of important deadlines – one more example of a caring citizen helping out his town.

With the deterioration of that sign and the advent of technology, the Borough is installing a new computer-generated sign.

Mr. Scaccia's sign has been commemorated with a photograph, and the plaque bearing his family name has been preserved, so that his generosity can be appreciated in perpetuity.

In other news, with a generous grant from Monmouth County, the Parker Homestead barns are being stabilized and renovated.

The Parker Homestead Committee, chaired by Monte Edwards, has been working hard to move that project forward. A charitable corporation has been formed to lease the property from the Borough, and will raise funds to operate it as an historic, educational facility, as Julia Parker wished when she left it to the Borough.

Over at Point Road School, two new classrooms have been added, making room for full-time kindergarten this year, a first for Little Silver Schools.

And speaking of education, many of you enjoy our library and the excellent service it provides. Key to that operation has been one of our Library Assistants, Gail Spencer. After 30 years of service, Gail will retire on September 30. While we hate to lose her, we wish Gail well in retirement.

On Thursday, September 26, the Library will host an open house from 1:30-4:30 (with refreshments) to wish Gail well. Please stop in.

Lastly, a reminder that many of our friends, neighbors and residents continue to struggle with rebuilding and other Sandy-related circumstances. For those interested in funding to raise their homes, the deadline for applying for a state grant is September 15. Application information is available at www.littlesilver.org.

County To Sponsor Paper Shredding

Opportunities to dispose of old documents safely

All shredding events will be held 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. at the following locations:

- Saturday, September 7: Wall Township Municipal Complex, 2700 Allaire Road
- Saturday, September 21: Manasquan 4th Avenue parking
- Sunday, September 29: Keansburg High School, 190 Port Monmouth Road
- Saturday, October 19: Borough of Shrewsbury Municipal Complex, 419 Sycamore Avenue
- Saturday, November 2: Freehold Township Municipal Complex, 1 Municipal Plaza

County residents may bring up to 100 lbs. to be shredded. The shredding event will stop once the shredding truck is full. All papers will be shredded on location in the mobile truck. Documents should be free of large binder clips, but staples and paper clips may be left on documents.

This is a project of the Monmouth County Board of Chosen Freeholders and partner municipalities.
