Message from Mayor Neff

Every once in a while an image will perfectly capture a moment, and sometimes the spirit of an entire town.

So before I even begin this message, I want to suggest that you visit the Little Silver Fire Company's facebook page, and check out the photograph of former Chief Walt Stearns dancing with Margaret O'Dell to the calliope music being played during the Memorial Day parade on Willow Drive.

If you missed the parade and the ceremony afterward in Memorial Park, I hope the photo inspires you to join us next year for the unofficial start to summer, and to honor our fallen soldiers, particularly our sons from Little Silver.

Little Silver has lost seven young men to war since World War I. Their names, and those from Little Silver who served during wartime, are on the monuments in Memorial Park. Please think of them and their families often.

June, of course, brings the official start to summer. Our eighth graders will be graduating from Markham Place School soon, and our high school seniors are planning out their futures. We wish them all well.

With the early summer also comes great walking weather, so please be reminded of Police Chief Dan Shaffery's request to all motorists: watch out for pedestrians, and be sure to stop when they are in the crosswalks. They have the right of way.

In fact, we're hoping that walking through the downtown area becomes easier, and safer, now that the borough has been awarded a \$200,000 grant for the

repair of sidewalks on Prospect Avenue and Church Street. In addition, the Borough Council has been discussing ways to improve safety at the intersections of Prospect, Willow Drive and Kings. An application for assistance from a fund focused on safe travel to our elementary schools may help.

On June 14, please stop by the Fire House to celebrate the arrival of our ladder truck, which replaces an old and unsafe pumper. It has already been called into service a number of times. The LSFD plans a family-friendly celebration from 4 to 10 p.m. Details can be found at www.littlesilverfd.org.

Over at the Little Silver Library, June kicks off summer reading, and Librarian Anita O'Brien invites children, tweens and adults to participate in their always-successful summer reading program. Win a prize! More at the Library, and on their website, www.littlesilver.lib.nj.us.

Library Hosts Local Author

Monday, June 23, 7:00 p.m.

Vintage images coupled with facts and anecdotes culled by local author Eileen Moon reveal the fascinating history of legendary locals in Red Bank. The book covers both town greats and unsung heroes like James Avati, "the Rembrandt of Paperbacks" whose illustrations have graced thousands of book covers, including J.D. Salinger's *Catcher in the Rye* and Richard Wright's *Black Boy*; Florence Forgotson Adams, the first woman admitted to the Monmouth County Bar Association and paved the way for all the women who followed her into the legal profession in Red Bank; and Sigmund Eisner, a Jewish immigrant who grew a modest clothing business into a major manufacturing empire.

Moon is excited to share the new book with local residents. "My hope is that the book demonstrates how connected we are from generation to generation...and reminds us all how much we have to learn from each other," she said. Don't miss meeting and hearing from this interesting local author on June 23.
