Recycling Reminders



BRANCH AND LIMB COLLECTION

Residents are reminded that limbs/branches collection ends for the season in October. Collection will resume in January, according to the 2012 placement to the curb schedule, which will be available in December.

RECYCLING DROP-OFF CENTER

The Borough Recycling Center is located behind the Borough Garage on Fairview Avenue. Hours of operation are:

LEAVES MAY BE RAKED TO THE CURB OCTOBER 24 - DECEMBER 31

When raking leaves to the curb, please make sure no other debris, including brush, limbs and branches, is mixed in with the leaves. The farm site where Little Silver disposes the leaves is under strict regulations from NJ DEP. If other debris is mixed in with leaves, they will not be collected.

Please do not block storm drains or safe passage on sidewalks.

Earth Friendly Alternatives for Leaf Disposal

Gardeners know that leaves are excellent material for compost bins. However, many residents don't have room for compost bins, time for tending them, or enough material for traditional composting. Some aren't even interested in using compost to amend garden soils.

Leaves can easily be recycled by turning them into organic mulch. Simply chop them up by running over them with the lawnmower (at highest setting to avoid lawn damage), then blow or rake them under shrubbery and trees and into gardens. A layer of chopped leaves will help protect tree and plant roots over the cold winter, while adding rich nutrients to the soil. By next spring, they will hardly be noticeable, as they will decompose over the winter and become a valuable part of the soil surrounding trees and plants. Leaves can also be tilled into vegetable and flower garden soil, which will add important nutrients and help improve soil texture and moisture retention. Finely shredded leaves can be left on lawns to enrich the soil and discourage weeds. They can also be kept in plastic bags (cut a few holes in the bags for air and moisture) to mix into next spring's container soil, for soil fertility and good drainage. Those who do maintain compost bins should save a few bags of leaves over the winter, then add them to the compost bin next spring when "green" material is more abundant than "brown" — it will speed the decomposition process to create healthy, rich compost.

Pine needles are also a beneficial garden resource. Instead of raking to the curb for disposal, they can be left under the trees where they fall, which will help protect the tree's roots. Pine needles and oak leaves make excellent mulch to help maintain soil acidity and protect shallow roots, particularly for acid-loving plants such as hydrangeas, azaleas and rhododendrons, through freezing weather.

Consider recycling and reusing leaves — they are a valuable natural resource! Keeping them out of roadways for disposal also helps keep storm drains and waterways free of waste and excess debris.

PARKER HOMESTEAD National Register Listing On Horizon!

A milestone in the preservation of the Parker Homestead-1665 is anticipated in September, when the N.J. State Review Board of Historic Sites will decide whether to nominate the Homestead for listing on the New Jersey and National Registers of Historic Places.

The Borough's application, prepared by Monmouth University Professor of History, Richard Veit, in cooperation with Mills and Schnoering Architects, was filed earlier this summer.

"Listing provides the recognition of the community's historic importance and assures protective review of public projects that might adversely affect the character of the historic property," said Daniel D. Saunders, Acting Administrator of the Board.

Neither "the State or Federal governments attach restrictive covenants to the properties or seek to acquire them," he also noted.

Several members of the Parker Homestead-1665 Committee, lead by Chairman Monte Edwards, and representatives of the Borough Council, will attend the Review Board meeting to lend their support to the application.

"Our only regret," said Edwards, "is that Mayor Suzy Castleman, who worked tirelessly for so many years to make Julia Parker's dream of preserving the property a reality, will not be there."

FROM THE FIREHOUSE

Recently the Little Silver Volunteer Fire Company #1 experienced the death of a former Chief. A person who happened by the firehouse at the time the funeral cortege passed asked about the ceremony and tradition.

The Fire Service is rich with ceremony, custom and tradition. For our Company, the final honors ritual calls for the body to be taken from the church to the cemetery borne on the hose bed of a fire engine whose lights, bell and siren have been covered in black cloth. LSVFC#1 uses our 1935 American LaFrance pumper for the ceremony, accompanied by all Fire Company and EMS vehicles.

The funeral cortege is to pass the firehouse under an American flag supported by two aerial ladder trucks. The cortege stops in front of the firehouse where the departed's fire gear is draped over a chair while officers stand at each side. A fire bell is then used to tap out the signal 5-5-5-5 four times, while the Company stands at attention and salutes. A single siren then sounds and the cortege proceeds to the cemetery.

Specifically, the inquirer asked about the custom of ringing the bell 5-5-5-5 four times. The ringing of the bell has its origins in 1865 by the New York City Fire Department with the assassination of President Lincoln, long before the use of radios, when fire alarms and announcements were dispatched by a system of bell commands and telegraph. Each different type of alarm or announcement would have its own number and series of bell strikes. When a firefighter died in the line-of-duty headquarters would transmit five bell strikes, repeated four times.

This custom has continued over the past 146 years and this form of rendering final honors to the departed is known in the fire service as “striking the four fives”.

Among other happenings at the Firehouse, allow us to remind you that the annual fund drive is now in progress. Your support means we can continue our programs such as the Halloween Parade, sports activities on Firemen’s Field, and maintenance of the firehouse and grounds. We thank the community for your ongoing support.
